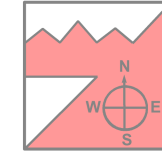


Bridle Trails State Park

5 Meter Contours



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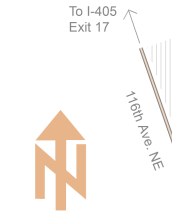
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Legend

- building, ruin, small ruin
- power line
- paved road
- dirt road, vehicle track
- foot path, small path
- less distinct small path
- contour (5 m), index contour, form line
- small (normal / elongated) / large knoll
- pit, small / large depression
- small / large erosion gully, broken ground
- small earth wall, dirtbank
- watercourse, minor water channel
- narrow marsh, spring, hydrant or faucet
- rootstock, stump, single tree
- high fence, fence, ruined fence
- boulder cluster, boulder field, rocky pit
- boulder, large boulder, stony ground
- passable rock face, impassable cliff
- special man-made feature, rock wall
- distinct vegetation / cultivation boundary
- open land, cultivated land, rough open land
- land with scattered trees: open / rough open
- undergrowth: slow running / difficult to run
- forest: open, slow running
- vegetation: difficult to run / fight
- out of bounds, settlement
- bare rock, sandy ground
- hard surface / parking area (paved)
- lake (river) / pond
- uncrossable / crossable / indistinct marsh
